Opening in September 1947, the Better Philadelphia Exhibit attracted over 340,000 visitors over a two month run. The exhibit attempted to inspire Philadelphians to think seriously about big ideas and grand possibilities for their urban landscape—and to a great extent succeeded in doing so. While visionary in scope, many of the proposals were ultimately realized, such as the “greenways” of Society Hill and the replacement of the “Chinese wall.”
